

What makes me proud of our place?

Reading

We will be reading a range of texts including 'Winnie the Witch', 'Where the Wild Things Are' and 'On the Way Home'.

Science

The children will:

- Plant seeds and over time observe how the plant grows, recording changes
- Find plants in the wild and identify them by picture
- Identify and explain what a deciduous tree and an evergreen tree is
- Name, sort and compare common fruit and vegetable plants
- Name and compare common plants and trees
- Observe and describe weather associated with the seasons - Spring

Maths

- Addition within 20
- Subtraction within 20
- Length

Geography

The children will be learning about their school and local area. They will:

- Use simple fieldwork and observational skills to study the geography of the local area
- Identify the key human & physical features of Great Hollands
- Use basic geographical vocabulary for key features
- Use simple compass direction (North, South, East, West)
- Use locational and directional language to describe the location of features and routes on a map of a route around Great Hollands
- Devise a simple map
- Use and construct basic symbols in a key.

Music

Round and Round

- The children will listen and appraise the song.
- They will sing and play instruments, both to improvise and compose.

PE

- Keeping myself healthy.

Art

The children will look at Van Gogh 'Sunflowers' and create their own large sunflower using colour mixing and collage. They will:

- Learn about art created by Van Gogh
- Make an observational drawing of sunflowers
- Explore colour mixing - primary and secondary colours
- Explore using collage

Computing

- Use a computer to write.
- Identify and find keys, before adding text to their page.
- Identify that the look of text can be changed on a computer.
- Make careful choices when changing text.

Writing

Understanding the features of different literary genres. Working on a three week cycle the children will have opportunities to imitate a text taught, then innovate as a class and then independently create their own piece of writing.

Literary Genres this half term include:

- Traditional tales - Little Red Riding Hood
- Letter Writing - Letter to Little Red Riding Hood from the wolf
