

# Year 3 and 4 – Light Learning in Science

The children in Hawks and Falcons class have had a GREAT time this week beginning their new Science topic of **Light**.

The children have used torches to investigate materials which reflect the most light. They have used mirrors to create reflected messages and navigate their way through a maze and have also identified ways to keep safe in the sun.
