#### **GREAT Playtimes at GHPS**

At the end of last term, Key Stage 2 children were invited to volunteer for positions as Peer Mediators or Playground Leaders. Those interested in doing so were asked to complete an application form, attend an interview and if they were successful, they had training for their new role.



Our Playground Leaders promote purposeful play by leading games and activities, which develop positive relationships and experiences for all our pupils. They are easily spotted on the



playground by the red caps that they wear. Our trained Peer Mediators also work around our school at lunchtime to help sort out disputes and conflicts. They aim to ensure that playtimes are happy times for all. To help them be easily noticeable, they wear yellow caps when on duty.

These are extremely valued and important roles within our areas of pupil responsibility. Both roles develop skills in leadership, teamwork and they also help to raise self-esteem and self-confidence.
