Our GREAT Learning

Year 1&2

Children in Year 1&2 have been using logical reasoning to predict outcomes. They have given

commands in different orders to investigate how the order affects the outcome. They have designed their own artwork and tested it for use in a program. They have also designed algorithms and then tested those algorithms as programs.









Year 3&4

Children in Years 3&4 have enjoyed an Egyptian themed day this week which saw them making cartouches and pyramids, baking Egyptian cookies and lots of other fabulous learning activities.











Year 5&6

This week in Year 5 and 6 we have been learning about appropriate use of the internet for Safer Internet Day. The children explored scams and what to look out for as well as phishing emails and alerts. They also spent time identifying ways to keep themselves safe online. We made some posters and mock scams to test our partners.


